ELIZABETH PARCELLS is currently singing with the Frankfurt Opera House, West Germany. In recent years she has been featured on radio, television and recordings. These engagements include the BBC, Radio Luxembourg Orchestra, and Decca Records.

Before residing in Europe, she was a regular soloist at King's Chapel, Boston, under Daniel Pinkham. She performed with the Handel and Haydn Society, the Boston Pops Orchestra under Arthur Fiedler, and debuted with the Boston Symphony Orchestra under Seiji Ozawa at the Tanglewood Music Festival.

In the Detroit metropolitan area Miss Parcells has performed with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, was soprano soloist for the performance of Handel's "Messiah" at U-M, was presented in concert for the 25th anniversary of the Grosse Pointe Summer Music Festival as well as her two appearances on our Musica Series. She has also appeared as a recitalist and in concert in San Francisco, New York, London, Paris, Zurich and Salzburg.
